


Later Friday we will officially meet with tapas and drinks (drinks pyo) in the lobby lounge overlooking the beautiful Tauranga inner harbour.



Announcing the BMW300



For those people who may be interested in "something a little different". We invite you to participate in the "BMW300" on Saturday.

For those of you who have undertaken a TT2000 there are similarities but with only a few checkpoints, all of which have to be visited. And, if you've never done a TT2K, then all the better and something new.

I recently did a course pre-run to ensure all is well and it is, time elapsed was approximately 6 hours which included a lunch stop plus stopping at all the locations to actually take a photo. You will need to put a bit of time aside prior to the ride to enter the Checkpoints and try and memorise the Mystery checkpoints.

The time taken to complete is not important.

The 'winner' is the rider that gains the most points riding the lowest number of K's, ensuring that all the photos are taken and taken correctly.

BMW300 RULES

This ride has neither Leader nor Tail End Charlie, each entrant will receive a package with a number of pages and a map.

The pages detailing the Checkpoints will have a photo of the required stop, a small portion of an NZ Topo map along with an approximate Latitude and Longitude, photo requirements and the type of road surface.

The pages for the Mystery points will only contain a photo with no location information, along with photo requirements and the type of road surface. All the Mystery photo locations are on the route and will (should) be

This ride is not a race, the winner(s) will be the person(s) who take the odometer start and finish photos and get the highest number of points by taking photos of the Checkpoints and Mystery locations with the lowest accumulated kilometre total.

Be mindful of the Toll roads in our area. These can be used at your cost or avoided if preferred.

In line with Club policy, all participants ride their own ride at their own risk.



The idea is to string the locations together in an orderly fashion, enter the coordinates into your GPS, drive to each of them and take a photo, ensuring yours and others safety, of your bike with the supplied hi-viz tape to closely match the image supplied, note that some photos are taken from across the road rather than having to actually cross the road..

The first and last photos should be of your bike's odometer at the beginning and end of the ride.

It is my intention that the ride proceeds in an anti-clockwise direction.

BMWMCANZ 2022 Annual Report

The government had only recently introduced the new Traffic Light Framework and at the time of the AGM we were in the RED setting as the first Omicron cases had just been detected late in January. Our National Rally which was planned to be held in Methven that same month unfortunately was another casualty and I remember vividly when the board had to make the call to cancel it. It was a very stressful time for everyone.

The 2022 Annual General Meeting and Board elections saw quite a significant change of guard in terms of board members. I took on the role of Club President, replacing Garry Williams, Stephen Parkinson was elected to my now vacant Vice Presidents' role and David Fish as the Club Secretary role taking over from David Ross. I'm not sure how we would have gotten through this year without their guidance, support, and historical knowledge.

Philip King who was elected as Member Representative in 2021 stood down from the role later in August 2022 for personal reasons. I want to take this opportunity to thank him for the time he served on the Board. Ian Macartney was seconded onto the board to fill this role on a temporary basis. Ian has very kindly decided to put himself forward for nomination to take on the role fully at the forthcoming 2023 AGM.

That said, we had a great number of attendees with more than 65 people registering for the Saturday night dinner. Many travelled from across the country to attend which was really pleasing. The weather Gods were not kind to us, but a big hats off to those who stuck it out in their tents at the campsite.

OPERATIONAL UPDATE

Throughout 2022 the board have been working hard to try and improve our member communication and engagement. Our Area Reaps are currently working through the process of using an external mailer platform that will enable us to create a template to standardise our regular messaging to members. Some have adopted this already and others are still working through the setup process. We have also updated our new member welcome pack.

It is really pleasing to see the marked improvement in the monthly magazine. This has predominantly been driven by Colin Gates our Treasurer who also currently wears the Editor hat. An immense amount of energy and effort from him with the support of the content submitters has gone into improving the image quality, the readability, and the reading options that we now have. I particularly like the flip book option. A big thank you to Colin for his expertise in this area and to all those who submit monthly editorials for the magazine, your contribution is appreciated.

Thanks also go to those organisations and individuals who pay to advertise in our club magazine. This advertising revenue helps cover our publishing costs and as members, we need to recognise our sponsors and support them when we can.

Our insurance partnership was due for renewal during the year. We spoke to a number of providers during the review process and ultimately, our partnership changed from AON to Star Insurance. It's never easy making these types of changes however the superior, more comprehensive, and competitive offer from Star was accepted by the Board. We are really looking forward to strengthening that partnership in the future.

Club membership over the last year has been steady with a small growth over the period. Initiatives such as discounted rates for the GS Rally for club members have helped with gaining new members however, we are still not as strong as we would like to be in the retention space. We are revising the membership renewal process to make it a little more

Treasurer's Financial Statements for the Financial Year ended 2022.

It gives me pleasure to present to our members the Treasurer's Report and Statement of Financial Position for the twelve months ended 30th September 2022.

We prepare our accounts on a 'Cash' and <u>NOT</u> an 'Accrual' basis. Therefore, they do not consider any outstanding debtors or creditors as of the balance date. However, when prepared, there was no other abnormal costs/income expected, from the normal operational income and expenditure.

Operational Income & Expenditure:

Income: Operating income for the period was \$38,598 compared to \$39,593 for the previous

12 months.

Subscriptions Up by \$2,512 compared to the previous 12 months

Expenditure Operational costs for the 12 months - \$28,536 compared to \$17,721 for the previous

12 months. The increase is largely due to face-to-face meetings happening once

more and the Area Rep meeting taking place.

Administration Up by \$1,433 to \$1,595. Includes \$1,071 for Membership Card blanks.

Travel & \$7815 up by \$5,659. Reflecting that face-to-face meetings are functioning again.

Meeting Costs Although most meetings are held online via Zoom.

Surplus/Deficit The result for the year is a reported operating deficit of \$1,751.

As reported last year, we received advanced payments for events that due to Covid

concerns were unfortunately cancelled. The deposits received in last year's

accounting period were refunded at the start of this financial period.

Net Assets as of 30th September are \$59,555

BMW Motorcycle Club of Aotearoa New Zealand - Risk Management Plan

The BMW Motorcycle Club of Aotearoa New Zealand is an organisation whose members join together for rides to nominated venues and for other social occasions. The organiser nominates the destination and regrouping stages along the way, but otherwise has no influence upon the way that riders behave on the road. There is no element of organised competition in the rides.

Riding Code:

- 1. All Club members on Club rides shall do so as individuals responsible for their own safety and shall take into account the safety of others they encounter on the ride.
- 2. Club members are responsible for ensuring that their motorcycles are in a safe and legal condition, the minimum being to Warrant of Fitness standards.
- 3. Riders, Pillions and sidecar passengers where required, shall have as a minimum standard New Zealand Approved Motorcycle Helmets, and stout footwear, gloves and clothing that will be capable of protecting their body in the event of a mishap.
- 4. Club Members are to go to the aid of any others suffering a mishap.
- 5. Rider organisers shall nominate the destination for the ride

as well as any regrouping locations or other stops. The organiser is not responsible for the other riders' behaviour or safety.

- 6. Riders shall ride at a speed and in a way that is comfortable for them. Do not ride outside your personal comfort envelope.
- 7. If a rider is unfamiliar with the route, they shall arrange to follow another rider who does know the way and who travels at a comfortable pace.
- 8. Riders who decide to travel as a group shall adopt a staggered riding formation such that there is an accepted following distance to the rider immediately in front. A reasonable following distance is indicated by a time of two seconds between riders for dry conditions and longer for inclement conditions and on loose surfaces.
- 9. The Ride Organiser and or the Club are not responsible for the participants' safety, and all participants participate at their own risk. All participants are aware that they are travelling on open public roads and are responsible for their own safety and compliance with the Road Rules and Laws.
